The Jefferson County Local Development Corporation held their board meeting on Thursday, April 7, 2022 in the board room at 800 Starbuck Avenue, Watertown, NY.

I. Call to Order: Chairman Aliasso called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m.

II. Pledge of Allegiance

III. Privilege of the Floor: Chairman Aliasso invited guests to speak. No one spoke.

IV. Minutes: Minutes of the meeting held March 3, 2022 were presented. A motion to approve the minutes as presented was made by Mr. Converse, seconded by Mr. Johnson. All in favor. Carried.

V. Treasurer's Report: Mr. Warneck reviewed the financials for the period ending March 31, 2022. He said the accounting software conversion took place, but noted that the financials look confusing this month because the stub period totals were included. A motion was made by Mr. Warneck to accept the financial report as presented, seconded by Mr. Gardner. All in favor. Carried.

Proposed 15-month Budget (10/1/21 – 12/31/22) – Mr. Eaton said that he made some minor changes and cleaned up some errors. He noted that the 15-month budget will need to be resubmitted to the state. A motion was made by Mr. Warneck to adopt the 15-month budget as presented, seconded by Mr. Burto. All in favor. Carried.

VI. Committee Reports:

a. Loan Review Committee – Mr. Converse noted that the JCLDC and JCIDA held a joint loan review meeting, and said the action will be taken at the JCIDA board meeting later today.

VII. Council Reports:

- a. Ag Mr. Matteson updated the board on the following topics:
 - Ag conference Mr. Matteson said the conference will be held tomorrow, April 8, 2022 at the Hilton Garden Inn. He said Dr. Todd Schmit will share his economic impact analysis at the conference and noted that Catharine Young (Cornell AgriTech) and Jennifer Coleman (Aimpoint Research) will also make presentations.
 - CWT Farms International Mr. Matteson said that the company is planning an official announcement on Monday about their proposed project.
 - Food resiliency grants Mr. Matteson said that he has received some grant applications and indicated that he is working with three meat processors in the county to encourage them to submit an application. Mr. Warneck asked Mr. Matteson to send a list of the grant applicants to board members. Mr. Matteson said he will.
 - Dairy Parade Mr. Matteson said that he is planning for the dairy parade that will be held on June 3, 2022.
- **b.** Manufacturing Mr. Zembiec reported that 50 people attended the Jefferson-Lewis manufacturing forum that was held at Carthage at Zero Dock Street on March 24th. He said they focused on workforce issues. The event was held jointly with Lewis County Economic Development.
- c. Marketing Mr. Weir mentioned that the childcare initiative was featured on NPR. He reported that he attended the Town of Hounsfield planning board meeting on Tuesday while they discussed the Convalt Energy project. He noted that the neighbors that live across the street from the project had some questions, but indicated that they will not stand against the project. Mr. Zembiec said the General Brown school district approved the PILOT last night.

X. New Business:

- 1. County of Jefferson ARPA Fund Contract Mr. Zembiec said that the County passed the resolution, but indicated that we did not receive the contract in time for the meeting.
- 2. CAPC Agreement for ARPA Funds Chairman Aliasso said the agreement outlines the program for the total grant of \$774,000 to the CAPC, contingent upon the JCLDC's receipt of funds from the County of Jefferson through the JCIDA. The agreement shall be in effect through June 30, 2023. A motion was made by Mr. Converse to approve the agreement, seconded by Mr. Johnson. All in favor. Carried.

- 3. Resolution No. 04.07.2022.01 to advance funds to the CAPC for the expansion of child care services Mr. Zembiec said that CAPC has requested reimbursements for expenses to be made in the month of April. Mr. Zembiec said that he is asking the board to advance \$67,000 for the first quarter for retention, new staffing positions and daycare services until the ARPA contract is signed with the County of Jefferson and the money becomes available. A motion was made by Mr. Warneck to approve the resolution, seconded by Mr. Gardner. All in favor. Carried.
- XI. Adjournment: With no further business before the board, a motion to adjourn was made by Mr. Converse, seconded by Mr. Warneck. All in favor. The meeting adjourned at 8:22 a.m.

AGREEMENT

Between

Jefferson County Industrial Development Agency (JCIDA)

And

Jefferson County Local Development Corporation (JCLDC)

For Delivery of

Pandemic Relief Programs in Relation to the American Rescue Plan Act

May 5, 2022

WHEREAS, Jefferson County (COUNTY) has received funding from United States Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (hereinafter "SLFRF") to respond to economic and public health impacts of COVID-19, and

WHEREAS, the COUNTY has selected the JCIDA as a sub-recipient to provide services in the form of administration and operation of certain programs to address pandemic response needs, mitigate financial hardships for local business, expand high quality child care, and address infrastructure needs for the benefit of the citizens of Jefferson, and

WHEREAS, the JCIDA wishes to sub-contract the delivery of certain programs through the JCLDC;

NOW THEREFORE, the JCIDA and JCLDC agree as follows:

SECTION 1. TERM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall commence on the date set out above, and shall remain in effect until December 31, 2024.

SECTION 2. JCLDC PROGRAM EXECUTION RESPONSIBILITIES

JCLDC shall undertake all necessary steps to complete the programs listed:

- (1) Small business productivity improvement and incumbent worker training. \$425,000.00
- (2) Rental property deferred maintenance program.

\$425,000.00

(3) Local foods resiliency initiative.

\$400,000.00

(4) Expansion of childcare services.

\$809,000.00

JCLDC shall be responsible for development and execution of all implementation details, program monitoring and close-out activities.

JCLDC will be fully responsible for providing all necessary documentation to the JCIDA to support full and complete delivery of the programs.

JCLDC shall maintain appropriate forms, records and systems, for reporting and documentation of program costs, program beneficiaries, and all other information required to be maintained pursuant to the rules, regulations, and policies applicable to the SLFRF.

JCLDC shall comply with all applicable State and federal equal employment opportunity requirements.

JCLDC shall comply with the applicable Uniform Administrative Requirements as described in 2 C.F.R. Part 200, and shall take all other reasonable actions as may be necessary to effect the programs in a manner consistent with the SLFRF laws, regulations, and policies.

SECTION 3. ACCOUNTING AND RECORDS

JCLDC will set up and follow accounting practices which strictly monitor the receipt and disbursal of all SLFRF funds. JCLDC will coordinate with JCIDA to assure that such practices meet all requirements and that there are no undue delays in the receipt and expenditure of funds and the implementation of the programs. All records relative to receipt of funds, funding documentation, review and approval documents, all expenditures of funds, and any other documentation required by JCIDA and COUNTY shall be maintained by JCLDC throughout the life of this Agreement and for a period of six years thereafter. Any such documentation shall be made available at any and all reasonable times and places as required by JCIDA, the COUNTY, or any other duly authorized representative of the State or federal government for review or auditing. JCLDC shall fully cooperate with any and all reasonable requests of JCIDA and COUNTY for provision of records, review of documents, auditing or accounting activities as the JCIDA or the COUNTY, by their sole discretion, deems necessary and appropriate.

SECTION 4. USE AND REVERSION OF ASSETS

Upon expiration of this Agreement, JCLDC shall transfer to the JCIDA any SLFRF funds on hand which have not been used for SLFRF purposes specified in **Section 2** of this agreement.

SECTION 5. AUDIT

Annually during the term of this Agreement and for three years thereafter, JCLDC shall provide the JCIDA with a copy of the JCLDC Single Audit. Such Audit shall be completed in a timely fashion in accordance with currently relevant OMB Circulars and in accordance with all requirements of SLFRF.

SECTION 6. GRANT CONDITIONS

JCLDC acknowledges it has reviewed the SLFRF Compliance and Reporting Guidance and fully agrees to comply with all terms and conditions of this document as is applicable to SLFRF subrecipients.

JCLDC acknowledges and agrees that use of funds pursuant to this agreement is subject to 31 C.F. R. Part 35, §35.10 and that any amount of program funds used in violation of Part 35 may be recouped by the Secretary of the Treasury. In the event of notification of violation by the Secretary, JCLDC and its subcontractors agree to assist the JCIDA and COUNTY in responding to and defending said violations with records, testimony or other cooperation as requested by JCIDA and COUNTY. In the event of a final determination of recoupment, the obligation to defend and indemnify under Paragraph 12 of this Agreement shall apply.

SECTION 7. INSURANCE

JCLDC shall maintain or cause to be maintained, in full force and effect during the term of this Agreement, at its expense, Workers' Compensation Insurance, Employer's Liability Insurance, Disability Insurance, Commercial General Liability Insurance, Motor Vehicle Liability Insurance and other insurance with stated minimum coverages, all as listed below. Such policies are to be in the broadest form available on usual commercial terms, shall be written by insurers licensed to do business in the State of New York and which have an A.M. Best Rating of A(-) or better as determined in the most recent A.M. Best publication, and who have been fully informed as to the nature of the SERVICES to be performed, and shall cover risks and liability to JCLDC resulting from this Agreement. Commercial General Liability shall include personal injury liability.

The JCLDC, COUNTY, its officers, employees and agents shall be named as additional insureds on a primary and non-contributory basis on JCLDC'S Commercial General Liability policy. In addition, a waiver of subrogation shall apply in favor of the JCIDA, the COUNTY, its officers, employees and agents on JCLDC'S Commercial General Liability policy. It is further understood that any obligations imposed upon the insured (including, without limitation, the liability to pay premiums) shall be the sole obligation of JCLDC and not those of the JCIDA or COUNTY.

Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Agreement, JCIDA irrevocably waives all claims against the JCIDA and the COUNTY for all losses, damages, claims or expenses resulting from risks commercially insurable under this insurance described in this Section. The provision of insurance by JCLDC shall not in any way limit JCLDC's liability under this Agreement.

Each policy of insurance required herein shall be specifically endorsed to provide that in the event of cancellation, non-renewal, or material change on the part of the insurer, prior written notice shall be provided to JCIDA and the COUNTY in accordance with the terms of the JCLDCS policy. The inclusion of such endorsement shall be confirmed on the certificates of insurance required herein.

At the time of execution of this Agreement, and upon each policy renewal, JCLDC shall submit to JCIDA certificates of insurance evidencing JCLDC's compliance with the requirements of this Section, including certificates of insurance from any approved subcontractors. The JCLDC shall furnish the appropriate ACORD Form Certificate of Insurance to the JCIDA to evidence all coverage set forth above except Workers' Compensation and Disability Insurance, A copy of the additional insured and waiver of subrogation endorsement forms must be submitted with the insurance certificates.

Workers' Compensation coverage must be evidenced by Form C105.2 or New York State Insurance Fund Form U26.3. Disability Insurance coverage must be evidenced by Form DB120.

SECTION 8. INDEMNIFICATION

JCLDC agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless JCIDA, the COUNTY, and its officers, employees and agents from and against any and all claims, liens, demands, judgments, penalties, fines, liabilities, settlements, damages, costs and expenses of whatever kind of nature (including, without limitation, attorney's fees and disbursements), known or unknown, contingent or otherwise, whether incurred as a result of a claim by a third party or any other person or entity, arising out of or in any way related to: (a) the activities, work or operations of JCLDC in the performance of this Agreement and the programs; or (b) JCLDC's failure to comply with any of the provisions of this Agreement or of the Law.

Insofar as the facts and Law relating to any claim would preclude COUNTY, or its officers, employees or agents, from being completely indemnified by JCLDC, the JCIDA, COUNTY and officers, agents and employees, shall be partially indemnified by JCLDC to the fullest extent permitted by Law.

The acts or omissions of any party employed directly or indirectly by JCLDC, shall be deemed to be that of JCLDC for the purposes of the JCLDC obligations to defend, indemnify and hold harmless under this Section. The fact that a party so employed by JCLDC is alleged to or is proven to have acted outside the scope of employment, agency or contract, shall not relieve JCLDC of any of its duties under this Section.

PROVISIONS:

- 1. <u>Binding Effect</u>. This Agreement shall inure to the benefit of and shall be binding upon the JCIDA, the JCLDC, and their respective successors and assigns.
- 2. Severability. In the event any provision of this Agreement shall be held invalid or unenforceable by any court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not invalidate or render unenforceable any other provision hereof.
- 3. <u>Amendments, Changes and Modifications</u>. Neither this Agreement nor any of the Project Documents may be amended, changed, modified, altered or terminated without the concurring written consent of the parties hereto.
- 4. Execution of Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in several counterparts, each of which shall be an original and all of which shall constitute but one and the same instrument.
- 5. <u>Applicable Law</u>. This Agreement shall be governed, construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of New York for contracts to be wholly performed therein.
