I. Call to Order: Chairman Aliasso called the meeting to order at 8:00 a.m.

- II. Pledge of Allegiance
- III. Privilege of the Floor: Chairman Aliasso invited guests to speak. No one spoke.
- IV. Minutes: Minutes of the meeting held May 5, 2022 were presented. A motion to approve the minutes as presented was made by Mr. Converse, seconded by Mr. Jennings. All in favor. Carried.
- V. Treasurer's Report: Mr. Warneck reviewed the financials for the period ending May 31, 2022. He indicated that there is not a lot of significant changes from the previous month. He reported that the increase in miscellaneous revenue was the transfer of \$79,000 from the JCCFDC. Chairman Aliasso asked if it is still the intention of LCO Destiny to pay off their loan. Mr. Eaton said yes and indicated that he hasn't heard of any changes. He said the closing should occur in July. A motion was made by Mr. Warneck to accept the financial report as presented, seconded by Mr. Johnson. All in favor. Carried.
- VI. Committee Reports: None.

VII. Council Reports:

a. Ag – Mr. Matteson said the dairy parade will be held tomorrow at 7 p.m. He said that he has 55 entries. Mr. Matteson said that he continues to work with businesses who want to expand and with CWT Farms on their project.



- b. Manufacturing Mr. Zembiec reported that career jam was held last week. He said that 26 schools (over 2,000 children) participated. He said that he helped arrange a meeting held at Fort Drum to discuss healthcare worker recruitments and to try to figure out how to get training/credit for those leaving the Fort and enter into the healthcare community. Mr. Zembiec said that the manufacturing committee is reviving Manufacturing Day that will be held in October now that schools are taking field trips and manufacturing companies are welcoming tours again.
- c. Marketing Mr. Weir announced that a press release went out yesterday for the small business productivity improvement program.

Mr. Weir said that he attended the NYS EDC meeting in Cooperstown last week. He said the most vibrant and well attended agenda item was related to the cannabis discussion. Mr. Matteson commented that there is money to be made, but he feels that there will be an initial boom and then will become a commodity crop.

Mr. Weir said that he participated in a roundtable discussion at the meeting and noted that NYS is following the Convalt project very closely.

VIII. Unfinished Business:

1. Food Resiliency Grants – Mr. Matteson said the grant application deadline was April 15th. He said that the County Board of Legislators allocated \$400,000 from the ARPA funds that was split into three sectors: 1) \$150,000 for dairy processing, 2) \$150,000 for meat processing, and 3) \$100,000 for other local foods. He said that we received 30 applications with a total project value of \$752,699.38. Mr. Matteson said that the applications were reviewed by himself, Mike Nuckols, Abbey Jantzi and Amanda Bickford from Cornell Cooperative Extension. He said the review included phone conversations and field visits.

Mr. Matteson noted that we did not require a match for this particular grant program. Mr. Warneck asked if the applicant has to spend the money first and then we reimburse them. Mr. Matteson said yes. Mr. Warneck asked if we will track the projects after payment and continue to work with them to get USDA approval. Mr. Matteson said yes.

This will set the stage for solar and possibly compatible commercial development to get the property back on the tax rolls. The project cost is \$1,150,000 with match coming from NYSERDA, Town of Wilna, Jefferson County, and JCIDA/JCLDC.



A motion was made by Mr. Warneck to approve the resolution, seconded by Mr. Gardner. All in favor. Carried.
